She was summoned to her late husband's village in Southeast Nigeria where she was assaulted, locked up in a room, made to shave her hair and drink the water used in bathing her husband's corpse. Mrs Nwachukwu is aggrieved and intends to file a suit against her husband's relatives in court. She has approached you as an expert in human rights law for advice. Advise her on the following:
- i) the nature of the suit to be filed
- ii) the court that can entertain the matter
- iii) her chances of success in the suit.
- The rights of children are to be respected, protected and fulfilled by States as the principal duty bearers; however, these rights are often violated. Discuss extensively three major forms of violation of children's rights.
- 4. In 2017 there was a presidential election in the Republic of Zantoira. The election was not free and fair.
